[REDACTED] would like to see the following considered by the Royal Commission in response to the recent redress consultation paper released. [REDACTED]'s ideas have been typed by a support worker from Open Place, however are [REDACTED]'s own words.

[REDACTED] would like to see the following by the powers that be, a resting place for Forgotten Australian's that are deceased and need to be buried and do not have any family. [REDACTED] would like to see land purchased by the Government to ensure there is a resting place for Forgotten Australian's once deceased. This would give [REDACTED] peace of mind that she won't be buried a pauper.

[REDACTED] would like to see full legal representation available to all Forgotten Australian's that are seeking compensation through the redress scheme at no cost, also free legal assistance for creating wills and any other legal concerns relating to history of time spent in out of home care.

[REDACTED] would like to see a card which recognises Forgotten Australian's as people with serious health issues due to lack of care provided in their early years.

[REDACTED] wants the Royal Commission to look into the deaths of Forgotten Australian children that died through 'misadventure' while in institutional care.
